Impact overall 2015-16

- We have successfully attained a Gold award from Sainsbury's School Games
- This school year we have spent some of our Sports Premium money on getting specialised

coaches in to teach sport within our school. We changed from 'Yours in Sport' the company we had been working with, as the teachers felt confident in what they had learnt from the previous two years. This year teachers have benefited from the specialised coaches coming in and by accessing quality CPD from the coaches whilst Team Teaching. .

- We have used a PE overview which ensures curriculum coverage and which also links to the School Games Level 2 calendars. We have accessed coaches in the term before an event in order to give quality coaching to the children resulting in them being ready to take part in a particular event. This has benefited the children greatly as the children have been taught to a good standard and as a result of the quality coaching we have reached the county finals for the Level 3 School Games Winter and Spring, the Winter Sports Hall Athletics and Spring Archery. We are also North Somerset champions for Archery and we came 2nd at the county finals. For the Sports Hall Athletics we came 4th in North Somerset. This is a fantastic achievement considering we are a small school and are competing against schools that can be 3 times the size of us! The children love to compete and represent their School, they all feel very proud of their school.
- By having the Sports Coaches in school we have made excellent links to local Sports clubs. Children can now access outside clubs after trying the sport in school. We have links with 9 local clubs which include Archery, Hockey, Gymnastics, Rugby, Netball, Tennis, Golf, Athletics and Football. The children in school certainly have a wide variety of sports available to them whilst at school and opportunities to experience sport outside of school too.
- This year as well as CPD taking place in school three members of staff went on a NCP Swimming Course. They now feel confident to lead the teaching of swimming and as a result we now swim for 1 hour a week for 10 weeks rather than 30 minutes a week for 20 weeks. This benefits the children's learning as well as being more cost effective. Also three members of staff went on the Matalan and Youth Sports Trust Top Sports and Skills training course and have incorporated this knowledge into their teaching.
- Within school we have trained our Year 6 School Games Crew to lead Sport and Games with in school at lunch time for KS1 children. Our behaviour issues at lunchtime have reduced as many more children are engaged.
- We have bought new equipment for both school sites for example... new gym mats, a mat trolley, speed stacking cups, hoops and bean bags. This means that children can access the curriculum without equipment being transported between sites. It is our intention to continue to resource more gym equipment, a set of Quick Sticks, an Archery Kit and some Tag Rugby equipment.

- This year we have got Weston Seagulls Community Trust coming into school to take an after school club, this is free to parents. This enables all children to take part in sport as the club is free for the children to attend. This means there is no financial barrier for children to be able to take part. This is open to all Key Stage 2 children and the sport focused on changes each term so that children get to try and learn new sports.
- The children are really loving taking part in the Sports offered to them either in their lessons, in after school clubs or in the local clubs. They enjoy competing and representing their school when we take part in competitions, festivals and sporting events. The children feel proud of themselves and of their school.
